Ben Hur, the epic movie about a Jewish Prince named Judah Ben Hur who is falsely accused by his traitorous friend Messala of trying to kill the Roman governor of Judea. Judah, who is born at the same time of Jesus, comes across the Jewish Messiah twice during his life. Judah and Jesus first meet when Jesus offers the exhausted prince a drink of water while Judah is being marched across the desert with other prisoners who will serve as slave rowers on Roman ships. Judah next meets Jesus on the day of Christ's death. From the moment of his arrest until the day of Jesus' death Judah Ben Hur is filled with hatred for Messala. His bitter anger leads Judah to become like Messala. But on the day of Jesus' death something happens to Judah. Arriving home after the crucifixion Judah says to his close friend Esther, "Almost at the moment He died, I heard Him say, 'Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do.' And I felt His voice take the sword out of my hand."

Each of us, in the corner of our hearts, harbors some bitter anger towards something, some circumstance or someone. The only One who can heal the bitter anger in our hearts is Jesus. Today please hear Jesus saying, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do." And let Jesus voice take the sword of bitterness out of your hand. It is then that you will know the freedom Jesus has for you to enjoy. As the apostle Paul says, "It is for freedom that Christ has set us free!"
